

Key Vocabulary:

Autumn	Autumn is the 3 rd season in the year.
light	Light is a form of energy. Light that we see is sunlight/ torchlight/ lighting in our houses.
dark	When the sun has gone down or the lights has been switched off.
celebration	To celebrate an event such as a birthday, Christmas, Diwali, Eid and many more.
fireworks	They are brightly coloured, they make noise, they light up the sky.
Diwali	The celebration of light.
Christmas	The celebration of the birth of Jesus.

The children should know that they have a birthday and say how they celebrate. Talks about and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world.
