Prove it:

Times Tables and Spellings:

Please encourage them to fill in their reading record book. These should be handed to the class teacher every Friday. Children get prizes the more they read!

Writing:

Over this half term we will be writing diary entries and creating brochures.

If possible, read some nonfiction texts about different cultures particularly American as this is our lead topic.

Topic Learning:

Children should complete at least 1 piece of topic home learning. What they do for this is their choice. Please see the next page for some ideas to get started!
