




What makes survival so challenging in the tundra biome?

Key Facts:

Biomes are found grouped together across lines of latitude on a map.

There are five main biomes, which are sometimes divided into smaller groups.

The climate of a country is determined by its longitude and latitude.

The arctic is in the North and the Antarctic is in the South.

People live permanently in the arctic but not the Antarctic because of the harsh conditions.

The tundra is threatened by climate change. The rise in global climate means that ice is melting and animals and vegetation cannot adapt to survive fast enough.

The tundra is the harshest biome in the world due to its position relative to the equator. It is very challenging for animals, vegetation and humans to live there.
