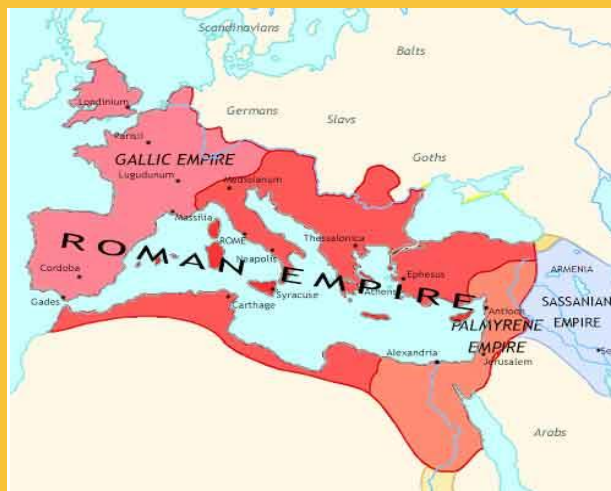


Were the Romans too ruthless for their own good?

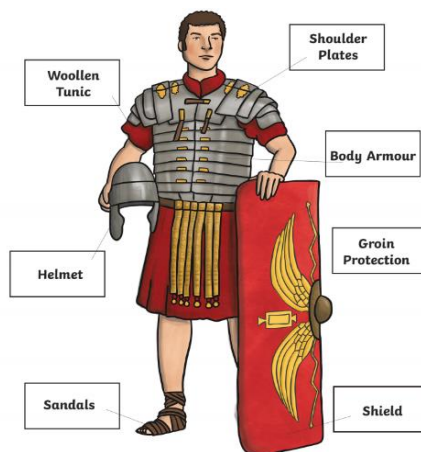

| The Roman Empire began in Rome, central Italy. |
| The Roman Empire invaded and occupied lots of central Europe and North Africa, including Great Britain. |
| The Romans had well trained armies who were well armed and organised. |
| Romans introduced lots of useful ideas which are still used today. |
| The Fall of the Roman Empire |
| Boudicca was a warrior queen, who lived in East Anglia, England and revolted against Roman rule. |
| Roman soldiers were eventually withdrawn from Britain and sent back to Rome. |
| Eventually the Roman Empire collapsed which allowed the spread of invaders called Anglo-Saxons. |
